RE: SB 7 Temporary Military Licenses

Director Maj. Gen. Deborah Ashenhurst (U.S. Army, retired):

Following the passage of Senate Bill 7 (133rd Ohio General Assembly), recently enacted Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 4743.041(l) requires a licensing agency to prepare an annual report regarding the number and type of temporary licenses or certificates the agency issued. Annually each state licensing agency must submit a report to the Director of Veterans Services regarding the number and type of temporary licenses or certificates issued during the previous fiscal year.

Pursuant to that requirement, the Ohio Board of Nursing reports that the Board issued five SB 7 temporary licenses for military personnel and spouses in the most recent fiscal year FY21 that ended June 30, 2021.

More importantly, the Board is pleased to report that it issued 2,558 expedited licenses for military personnel, veterans, and their spouses for FY21, as compared to 1,439 in FY19. This expedited license process for the military has been in place since the passage of House Bill 488 (130th Ohio General Assembly). The Board's licensure process for these expedited military licenses is set forth in Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Chapter 4723-2. No matter which route to Ohio licensure is chosen, the expedited path and processes clearly support military personnel, veterans, and their spouses as our numbers are growing.

Applicants learn about the licensing process and access the applications on the Board's website in a section dedicated to military licensing. A brief explanation of the various processes is as follows:

- Expedited Processing: The Board provides expedited processing for military personnel, veterans, and spouses. On the license or certification application, check the box "military or spouse of military."
- Temporary Military personnel, veterans, and spouses who are already licensed in another state as an RN, LPN, or APRN, can apply for a temporary permit, issued within 1-3 business days, to begin practicing in Ohio and then complete the licensing process.
- Temporary Military Licenses: Members of the military and spouses who are licensed in another jurisdiction and have moved to Ohio for active duty may apply for a temporary military license which can be issued after criminal records checks are received by the Board and other requirements are met.

The Board is proud to have these various expedited licenses available to military personnel, veterans, and their spouses. If you have questions regarding this report or the Board's processes, please feel free to contact me directly at 614-995-3684.

Date: July 27, 2020

Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 4743.041, the Counselor, Social Worker, and Marriage and Family Therapist Board reports issuing two licenses (1 Counselor, 1 Social Worker) pursuant to Senate Bill 7 in Fiscal Year 2020.

The Board is working on rules to implement the provisions of Senate Bill 7 legislation. The rules are currently awaiting a recommendation from the Common Sense Initiative.

The Board has worked with the other licensing boards to develop an enterprise solution in the eLicense system to allow military members and their spouses to apply for a temporary license via eLicense, making access to a license, as well as processing, easier.

Additionally, under Ohio Administrative Code Rule 4757-1-08 ("Military provisions related to licensure for counselors, social workers and/or marriage and family therapists"), the Board issued two (both Social Workers) licenses.

Legal Requirements

Requirement for Issuance of a Temporary Military Duty License

In accordance with section 4743.041 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Ohio Department of Education issues a one-year Temporary Military Duty license to practice as an educator in the state of Ohio. This license is issued to an individual who holds a valid license or certificate as an educator in another state or jurisdiction, is in good standing in that state or jurisdiction, and the individual or the individual's spouse is on military duty in this state.

Reporting Requirement

Under section 4743.041 of the Ohio Revised Code, each department, agency or office that issues a license or certificate to practice a trade or profession must, upon the conclusion of the state fiscal year, prepare a report on the number and type of temporary licenses or certificates that were issued during the fiscal year under this section. The report shall be provided to the Director of Veterans Services no later than 30 days after the end of the fiscal year. The director will compile the reports and make them available to the public.

Number of Licenses Issued

During Fiscal Year 2020, spanning from July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020, the Ohio Department of Education issued eight Temporary Military Duty Teaching licenses. These licenses were issued in the following licensure areas and grade bands:

The Vision Professionals Board is complying with Amended Substitute Senate Bill 7, which passed in the 133rd General Assembly, and became effective April 28, 2020. In part, ORC 4743.041 section I states:

Each department, agency, or office of this state that issues a license or certificate to practice a trade or profession, shall, upon the conclusion of the state fiscal year, prepare a report on the number and type of temporary licenses or certificates that were issued during the fiscal year under this section. The report shall be provided to the director of veterans services not later than thirty days after the end of the fiscal year. The director shall compile the reports and make them available to the public.

The Vision Professionals Board did not issue any licenses or certificates to practice in any of the areas of optometry, opticianry or ocularistry in SFY 21, for which the board has jurisdiction.
